SIZES

ONE SIZE

KNITTED MEASUREMENTS

Circumference 18" (45.5cm)

MATERIALS

- 1 skein **Tahki Yarns DONEGAL TWEED** 100% pure new wool (3.5oz/100g; 183yd/167m) in each color **#884 light gray (A)**, **#873 burnt orange (B)**, **#851 bright olive (C)**, and **#802 light teal (D)**
- Set of four size 9 (5.5mm) double pointed needles **OR SIZE TO OBTAIN GAUGE**
- One size 9 (5.5mm) circular needle 16"/40cm long for hat
- Stitch marker
- Yarn needle
- Pompom maker

GAUGE

18 sts and 22 rows = 4"/10 cm in St st over chart pattern.

TAKE TIME TO CHECK GAUGE

PATTERN STITCHES

Stockinette Stitch (St st)

K2, P2 Rib (multiple of 4 sts)

Rnd 1: *K2, p2; rep from * to end.

Rep Rnd 1 for k2, p2 rib.

NOTE: When working the fair isle pattern, make sure to loosely strand the unused color across the back of the work to maintain an even tension. If necessary change to larger size needles then make sure to change back to the smaller needles after completing the chart.

HAT

With circular needle and A, cast on 80 sts. Place marker for beginning of rnd and join to work in the rnd.

Rnds 1-8 Work k2, p2 rib to end.


Rnds 9 and 10 Knit.

Work 27 Rnds of Fair Isle chart. Work 24-st rep three times, then work sts 25-32.

With A, knit 6 rnds.

Shape Crown

Change to double pointed needles when there are no



longer enough sts to fit comfortably on circular needle.

Rnd 1 * K2tog, k1; rep from * to last 2 sts, k2 – 54 sts.

Rnd 2 Knit.

Rnd 3 * K2tog; rep from * to end – 27 sts.

Rnd 4 Knit.

Rnd 5 * K2tog; rep from * to last st, k1 – 14 sts.

Rnd 6 Knit.

Rnd 7 * K2tog; rep from * to end – 7 sts.

FINISHING

Cut yarn. Draw tail through remaining sts and pull tight to close top of hat. Fasten off.

Weave in ends.

Using B, C or D, make a pompom following manufacturers instructions that come with your pompom maker. Sew to top of hat.
